# Westford Academy Squad Now the "Gray Ghosts"

WESTFORD—The Westford academy football team was officially named the "Gray Ghosts" at the pep rally by Principal Joseph E. Joyce, as a result of an election held earlier in the day by the student council. The titles of Lancers and Eagles also were on the ballot.

Mr Joyce brought up the subject of class rings at the assembly before the pep rally, introducing the idea that one style of ring be chosen and honored permanently as the Westford academy ring. In previous years it has been the custom for the junior classes to meet and choose the style they prefer, so that each year the ring was different. This way there has been no distinctive design and the rings from classes of different years had only the W. A. imprint in association.

WESTFORD — The menus for the week at Westford academy cafeteria have been announced by Mrs. Dorothy M. Doucette, head dietician. One half pint of milk is served with each meal.

Monday: tomato juice, frankfurter in buttered roll, green beans, deep dish apple pie.

Tuesday: meat balls, tomato sauce, mashed potato, bread and butter, chocolate cream pudding.

Wednesday: baked pork chop, potato, buttered corn, bread and butter, raspberry gelatin with thin cream.

Thursday, pineapple and grapefruit juice, beef pie with vegetables, biscuit crust, bread and butter, fruit.

Friday, juice, bowl of clam chowder, peanut butter sandwiches, pineapple delight.
