Several years ago, the late Miss Marian Winnek deeded to the town (for the town people's use) a valuable chunk of land, which ever since has lain idle

The tract consists of 36 acres, running from Main Street near Milk Fleurs to the top of Prospect Hill and including what was once a clay pit and pottery works in Colonial days. This land has now grown up to brush, poison ivy and scrub trees

From the summit of Prospect Hill (once called Clay Pit Hill) one gets a tremendous view of the surrounding countryside. It is the highest point in Westford (450 feet above sea level) and it was here that the old Westford Water Company stationed its first water tower in 1909
