

Westford plaque nearly sold out

WESTFORD — The ceramic plaque designed by the Westford Historical Commission to include five events in the town's 250-year history is nearly sold out. Only 1,000 were produced.

The remaining short supply is now at various distribution points. When these are sold, that will be the end, according to Gordon B. Seavey, coordinator of the project which is tied in with the town's celebration this month, and which will benefit the town museum.

The tile is a companion piece to the successful plaque produced for the Bicentennial,

which is now a collector's item. It is produced in four colors on a white 6x6-inch ceramic base, with a cork backing. It may be hung or used as a table protection tile.

THE SKETCHES, which are excellent and produced by a Cape Cod artist on the plaque, start with the old meetinghouse, and then the Abbot mills, the town hall and seal, the Fletcher Library and the new academy.

Included in the white gift boxes are three recent post cards of Westford historical scenes.
