
Happy 260th **Birthday**

On Sept. 23, the town of Westford will mark its 260th birthday, albeit with less fanfare than it did for the 250th a decade ago. The town charter, passed and published on Sept. 23, 1729 defined the boundaries in the 'township by the name of Wesford' as follows: 'Beginning at the southeast corner, at a heap of stones, being the bounds between Chelmsford and the said town of Wesford; thence running north to a chestnut tree, marked and stones about it; so running on a straight line north to a pine tree, marked at Col. Tyng's farm; thence southerly by the Groten line till it comes to Littleton land; then by Littleton land southerly or southeasterly till it come to Concord line; thence easterly on Concord line to the bounds first mentioned.'
